In partnership with the University of Iowa's Initiative for Sustainable Communities and Iowa City-based muralist Ali Hval, we are excited to kick off alleyway activation in our downtown. This April, Ali will bring one of her iconic, brightly colored abstract murals to ACB's alleyway. Alleyway activation marks an exciting step forward in Burlington's public art and social gathering space initiatives. By transforming overlooked alleys into vibrant spaces for gathering, exploration, and connection, we are excited to collaborate with Ali, who has completed over 50 murals across the country. Public art is about community engagement, and we are planning special opportunities for the community to join Ali in painting the alley.

Ali is an Assistant Professor of Instruction in Painting and Drawing at the University of Iowa, where she earned her MFA with honors. Her work blends ceramics, installation, fabric, and painting. She has received grants from the Iowa Arts Council, the Windgate Fellowship, and the 2024-2025 Iowa Artist Fellowship. Ali has completed over 50 public murals nationwide, with features in The New Yorker, Create! Magazine, and exhibitions like NCECA and Ceysson y Bénétière in New York City.
